



**TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT**

**AGRICULTURAL TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM**  
**AND**  
**ADMISSION INTO THE**  
**BACHELOR'S DEGREE PROGRAMS**  
**COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE AND LIFE SCIENCES**

Students in the Agricultural Technology Program who want to transfer to a bachelor's degree program in the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences must submit the following documents to the Virginia Tech Office of Undergraduate Admissions, 201 Burruss Hall by March 1<sup>st</sup>:

1. Completed on-line transfer application with the appropriate application fee. Please make sure the box is checked that the student is applying under the Agricultural Technology Articulation Agreement.
2. An official high school transcript (This can be forwarded from the Agricultural Technology Office).
3. Official transcripts from all previously attended colleges or universities (These can be forwarded from the Agricultural Technology Office), and
4. Transcript from Agricultural Technology (This can be retrieved from Hokie Spa).

**ADMISSION CRITERIA**  
**(Applicant must meet either A or B)**

- A.** The student must have completed the Associate's degree in Agricultural Technology with an overall Virginia Tech GPA of 3.0 or better.

**AND**

The student's high school transcript must show completion of Virginia Tech's minimum course requirements for four year majors. This must include 4 units of English, 3 units of mathematics to include Algebra 1, Algebra 2 and Geometry, and at least 2 units of a lab science which must be chosen from biology, chemistry or physics. Three units are recommended for all science-related majors.

**AND**

The student must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better on all previous college work as determined by the Undergraduate Admissions Office.

**OR**

- B.** The student must have completed one year in the Agricultural Technology program with an overall Virginia Tech GPA of 3.0 or better, and must meet requirements set forth by undergraduate admissions to be competitive as a **freshman** applicant. This will include 4 units of English, 3 units of mathematics to include Algebra 1, Algebra 2 and Geometry, and at least 2 units of a lab science which must be chosen from biology, chemistry or physics. Three units are recommended for all science-related majors. Coursework completed after one year in Agricultural Technology, regardless of GPA will not be considered in the admissions process.

If a student was denied admission as a freshman applicant, their application will not be considered for transfer under this agreement until completion of the Agricultural Technology degree.

Applicants not meeting the above criteria will be encouraged to attend a community college for one year to complete core requirements in English, math, and science as appropriate for the intended major and earn a competitive cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better.

The department in which the student is admitted will evaluate the academic transcript(s) to determine what credit may be transferred. Admission may not be granted to a restricted major.
